M. Phil in PSW Programme of Savitribai Phule Pune University offered by Post-Graduate Department, Affiliated & Recognized Centers, Institutes and Colleges Continuous Assessment Pattern Education System (Regulations, Scheme of Examination and Course Content) w.e.f. Academic Year – 2020

1. Introduction: The degree of Master of Philosophy in Psychiatric Social Work is a Professional Post-Graduate degree in Psychiatric Social Work. It is a Minimum, standard and recognized educational qualification for appointment of Social Service Superintendents (Psychiatric), Psychiatric Social Worker (PSW) or Clinical Social Worker in various Governmental, and Non-Governmental Mental Health Institutes/ Projects/ Rehabilitation Centres and various kinds of Teaching/ Research and Mental Health Centres in the field of Social Work and Mental Health. Students who have completed their Post Graduation in Social Work can get admissions for the said course and create career opportunities to hold good Mental Health professional Positions in National, International Social Work and Mental Health Organizations or they can work with Research and Training Organizations, Rehabilitation Centres, Schools of Social Works or in Universities as Researchers, Rehabilitation Expert or Social Work and Mental Health Care Act 2017 clearly states the role, responsibility and recognition of Psychiatric Social Workers in the field of Mental Health.

2. M. Phil -Master of Philosophy in Psychiatric Social Work - Course Curriculum Pattern: General course pattern to be implemented w. e. f.-June-July 2020 (We may think of Semester, Credit and Choice based patterns from next academic year)

3. Eligibility: Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU) rules are applicable. Students who have completed their Post Graduation in Social Work (MSW) or M A in Social Work or appeared for the final year Post graduate MA in Social Work/ MSW Examinations from any UGC recognized University are eligible to apply for the M. Phil -Master of Philosophy in Psychiatric Social Work degree programme.

4. Medium of Instruction: The medium of Instruction shall be English. However, Savitribai Phule Pune University permits students to write examination answer books in Marathi or Hindi.

5. Mode of Selections of Students for course: The selection of the candidates is based on performance in the Common Entrance Test / Written Examination Test & Personal Interview.

6. Intake-Number of Seats: Eight (8) candidates per year.(Number may be increased or decreased)

8. Attendance and Course Contents: Minimum 80% attendance is mandatory to complete the course. Attending Class Room lectures, tutorials, Practical institutional work, Institutional Seminars, Fieldwork, and Case Conference etc. are the mandatory activities for MPhil (PSW) course completion.

Total Parts of the Course – It will be a Part I and Part II year based course, so there will not be a Semesters system for this Course. The semester system may be followed from next academic year onwards

9. Field Practicum (Field Work):

Students pursuing the M. Phil Psychiatric Social Work (PSW) course will be placed in the various general and specialized wards of hospitals for the practical field exposure. Students will learn and understand the practical Psychiatric Social Work and Mental Health field related aspects with the

help of their continuous field work placements in various hospital wards like Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Ward, De addiction Ward, Rehabilitation Ward, Family Assessment Unit, Adult Psychiatry Ward (Male and Female Sections), Occupational Therapy Unit and will be trained professionally with specialized field inputs.

A weekly Case conference/ Case Presentation of cases observed / assessed and allotted by the ward in charge/ Field Work Supervisors/ Conference Chairpersons / Dept of PSW is one of the special activity should be carried out by the students. Students are allotted with around five cases (number may vary) cases in a year for the case conferences. Students have to present one or two seminar/s on the basis of their theoretical subjects in the Institutional Seminar activity. Records of the Monthly clinical Field work activities, Case Conferences, Seminars and other all field work activities should be maintained by the students and must be submitted in the department of PSW for the required assessments.

A student who failed to submit the mandatory field work reports/ Case work reports will be considered as failed in the respective academic year and has to submit the due reports/ records to become pass

Revaluation: In any case, there is no provision of revaluation or moderation of field work/ Dissertation or research project or internal assessment marks.

9.1 Field Work Modules:

Marks: Total 100 marks for the 1st year Case Work Reports as a part of clinical Field work

9.2 In Field Work, it is mandatory on the part of faculty/ professional supervisors appointed or deputed by the institute, to follow all Government, University and institute's service rules, norms of regular monitoring, supervision, supervisory visits, attendance or attending duty at work place. The institute, centers are expected to work out monitoring mechanisms.(Subject to availability of the trained and qualified faculties / professionals in this field)

9.3 Viva Voce Examination:

There shall be a Viva-Voce Examination at the end of every year (Part- 1 and Part -2 or 1st and 2nd year) based on theory paper knowledge, Case Work or Case Study Reports, Clinical Interviews, Case Presentations, Dissertation or Research Project and all other practical, clinical field work practicum. (Case Work or Case History Reports as a part of Field work and other clinical aspects should be done with out of 100 marks in the 1st year and Dissertation / Research Project work will be assessed for 100 Marks at the end of 2nd year MPhil PSW).

9.4 Field Work and Other Reports / Documents Submissions:

- a) Total 90 submissions in both 1st and 2nd year are mandatory to complete the M. Phil in PSW course. It includes 30 Case Histories, 30 Clinical Interviews and 30 Individual, Family, group & Social Network Assessments.
- b) Students Must have to submit the 10 CASE REPORTS Two Months prior to ^{1st} year /Part- I Examination, Students appearing for Part-I Examination should submit the 3 hard bound Copies of their completed 10 case reports to the Faculty Supervisor/ Department of PSW at least Two-Months before the 1st year / Part-I Examinations, failing of which, students shall not be allowed to appear for the ^{1st} year / Part-I Examination.
- c) Students must have to submit the 90 Submissions at the End of 2nd year / Part-II Examinations. Students appearing for Part-II Examination should submit the 3 hard bound Copies of their completed 10 case reports to the Faculty Supervisor/ Department of PSW at least Two-Months before the 1st year / Part-II Examinations, failing of which, candidates shall not be allowed to appear for the 2nd year /Part-II Examinations.
- d) The Submitted case Reports will be evaluated by the External Examiners / members of the Board of 1st year /Part-I Examination with the addition of Internal Reports Assessment Marks
- e) DISSERTATION will be evaluated by the External Examiners / members of the Board of 2nd year / Part-II Examination with the addition of Internal Dissertation Assessment Marks.

10. Research Dissertation (100 marks)

- a) If opted, M. Phil in PSW student is required to select an appropriate topic for his/her research dissertation/
- **b**) Completion and submission of the Research Dissertation is a pre-condition for appearing at 2nd year / Part –II Examination. In any case no extension will be permissible for submission.

- c) The Student/ candidate must bring and submit three (3) hard bound copies of the completed dissertation in internal as well as external Dissertation viva voce examination which will be conducted at the end of 2nd year / Part –II Examination.
- d) There shall be only one Dissertation of 100 marks at M. Phil in PSW 2nd year / Part II and it shall be submitted to the Savitribai Phule Pune University through the Head of the PSW Department/Head of the Institute, recommended for submissions after Certification and approval of the concerned Dissertation Guide/ faculty supervisor.
- e) The research dissertation will be assessed and recommended for the final submission by the Faculty Guide/ internal and external examiner/ HOD Dept of PSW/ Head of the Institute. Combined passing internal, external and viva Voce examination in Dissertation shall be (50%) out of total marks.

f) A candidate failing in research dissertation will have to re-write and resubmit the revised dissertation/ with reconciliation of areas/issues highlighted in the Part-II Examination & to take up the Viva-Voce Examination on the dissertation.

11. Prescribed standard for Research Dissertation:

- a) The topic of Research Dissertation must be related to the area of Psychiatric Social Work / Mental Health. Ethical norms and concerns in research, plagiarism policy of the institute and University, must be adopted.
- b) In case of dissertation, Quantitative and qualitative research is permissible. The candidate must justify the design and follow the scientific process and methods of Social Research, Social Work Research/ Psychiatric Social Work Research.
- c) The Research Dissertation Topic and Research Methodology must be approved by the Research Ethical Committee/ Guide / Dept of PSW through the departmental presentation/s

12. Heads of passing, Standard of passing:

A) The following shall be the Independent Heads of Passing:

- 1. Written Theory Papers
- 2. Field Work
- 3. Research Dissertation
- 4. Viva Voce

13. Examination Rules (As per UOP Manual and Rules -125)

- a) University Examination of M. Phil in PSW course shall be conducted by the center/s as per University Ordinance/ Rules- 125/ or applicable/ revised from time to time.
- b) Examination will be held in two parts, Part-I & Part-II. (Part I in 1st year and Part II in 2nd year)
- c) Candidates will not be allowed to take the Part-II (2nd year) Examination unless s/he has passed the Part-I (1st year) Examination.
- d) Two separate Boards for Part-I & Part II shall conduct the Examination. Part-I Board shall be consisted of 4 examiners, 2 of them will be internal examiners &2 will be external examiners. Part-II Board shall be consisted of 4 examiners, 2 of them will be internal examiners &2 will be external examiners.
- e) A candidate shall appear for all the papers & submit Ten Case Reports/Dissertation as required for completion of academic fulfillment for Part-I (1st year) & Part – II (2nd Year).
- f) Field Work/ Dissertation, Assignments/ Case Reports, will be assessed and evaluated as per the evaluation criteria and standards framed by the respective training institute and the University, from time to time. Dissertation of Part-II examination shall be evaluated by the members of the Board.
- g) Viva Voce Examination for Part-I (1st year) and Viva Voce & Clinical Examination for Part-II (2nd year) shall be conducted by the Board.
- h) Assessment shall consist the yearly / year end / Part end based Examination and each shall have an equal weightage of 50 %.
- i) Each theory paper & case records/Case Reports of Part-I (1st Year) examination shall be evaluated by the Members of the board. The CA towards 50% marks will be a continuous activity and at least 10 Case Histories /Case Records/ Study Reports/ Case Reports (10 marks each) must be conducted for a full 100 marks assessments and / or the teacher should select a variety of mechanisms for evaluation such as:

I.Journal and Magazine reviews

- **II.Seminar presentation**
- III.Case Study Presentations
- **IV.Movie Analysis**

V.Short Quizzes

- j) The concerned teacher, in consultation with the Head of the PSW Department/ University PG Department/ Center, shall decide the nature of questions for a Written Test.
- k) A candidate will have to appear for all the Groups of Part-I (1st year) & Part-II (2nd Year)
 Examination when appearing for the first time.
- A candidate in Part-I (1st Year) & Part-II (2nd Year), failing in any of the "Group-A" subjects will have to reappear in all the "Group-A" Subjects.
- m) If a student missed an internal assessment examination. He /She will have a **second chance** with the endorsement of the Head of the PSW Department / Institute Head / Director in consultation with the concerned subject teacher. Such a second chance however, shall not be the right of the student.
- n) **CA marks will not change.** A student cannot repeat CA. In case He/ She wants to repeat CA, then He/ She can do so only by registering for the said course during the course year in which the course is conducted and up to 4 years (2 years program) as the case may be, provided the student has failed in that course.
- o) No candidate shall be allowed to appear either of Part-I (1st year) or Part-II (2nd Year) Examination more than three times.
- p) Supplementary Examination will be held for Part-I (1st year) & Part-II in the Month of following November for candidates failed in the Annual Examination.
- q) In either year candidates will have to reappear in all of the Papers of Group-'A' & Group- 'B' if not secured the PASS MARKS (50%).
- r) A candidate in Part-I (1st year), failing in the Case Report of the "Group-B" will have to resubmit the 10 CASE REPORTS in full & to take up the Viva-Voce Examination on those 10 CASE REPORTS.
- s) In either year candidates will have to reappear in all of the Papers of Group-'A' & Group- 'B' if not secured PASS MARKS (50%) in CASE REPORTS (Part-I/1st year) & DISSERTATION (Part-II/2nd Year).
- t) A candidate in Part-II, failing in the DISSERTATION of the "Group-B" will have to resubmit the Dissertation with reconciliation of areas/issues highlighted in the Part-II Examination & to take up the Viva-Voce Examination on the DISSERTATION
- u) There shall be a **revaluation** of the answer scripts of ESE/ Year/ part but not of CA as per the university Ordinance No.134 A & B/ and/or applicable rules.
- v) While marks will be given for all examinations, The year / Part end Mark sheets will have only Marks on mark sheets and final Marks sheets and transcripts shall have only Marks, Grades and total percentage of marks. The final Mark sheet will also indicate the PG center to which the candidate belongs.

14. Assessment and Grade point Average

- 14.1 Results of M. Phil in PSW will be declared for every year / Part and the final examination will give total Marks and Grades.
- 14.2 After the gain of minimum number of Marks (50 % Marks) towards a completion of a M. Phil in PSW program, a student will get a Mark sheet with total marks earned and a grades of the Marks
- 14.3 A candidate who fails in First Attempt & secures pass marks in Second Attempt or Third Attempt shall be declared to have fulfilled the requirements for conferring of M.Phil. Degree in **Pass Class.**

15. Admission procedure:

The course for M. Phil in Psychiatric Social Work (PSW) programme will be held at the Govt. Regional Institute for Psychiatry and Allied Sciences, Regional Mental Hospital, Yerwada, Pune (Maharashtra) with initial Academic support of Karve Institute of Social Service, Pune (Maharashtra) affiliated to the Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune (Maharashtra). The Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune shall provide the M. Phil Degree in Psychiatric Social Work (M.Phil in PSW) to the candidates who successfully complete the M. Phil in PSW Course.

The course is open to those who have obtained Master's degree in Social Work (MSW) or MA in Social Work from a University recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) securing not less than 55% marks in the aggregate of the Master's degree as a whole for candidates belonging to General Category. In case of Scheduled Caste (SC), Scheduled Tribe (ST) & Other Backward Class (OBC) Categories, it should be not less than 50% Marks in the Aggregate of the Master's Degree as a whole.

Candidates will have to successfully complete the Course in Maximum 4 year duration/ time.

Candidates exceeding the limit of 4 years will not be allowed to continue the M. Phil in Psychiatric Social Work Course; in that case the registration of the candidate/s will be lapsed. Readmission in the same Course shall not be possible/ will not be done

- 16. Reservation of Seats: The Govt of India Reservation guidelines will be followed for the admission process. M. Phil PSW Course is a professional Clinical Course and students from various parts of India may apply for the course, hence GoI reservation rules will be followed instead of Local University rules for the same.
- **17. Discipline:** Students are expected to follow all rules and maintain discipline throughout the period of the course. Students will be made aware of rules & expected norms of discipline at the beginning.

Ragging in any form, within or outside the campus, is strictly prohibited. In case a student is found violating the rules of discipline, the HOD, Dept of PSW/ Superintendent / Director/ Principal/ Head of the Institute can initiate appropriate course of action and ask him/her to discontinue the course or cancel his/her admission at any point of time, during the course.

18. Grant of terms: 100 per cent attendance is expected for field work/ Clinical work. Minimum 75% attendance is expected at the class room theory sessions/lectures. Leave is ordinarily not granted. In very exceptional circumstances leave subject to prior permission of the Head of the Institution must be obtained. Students are entitled for 30 days leave & for this; they must apply to the Head of the Department through the Supervisor & must not leave the campus until the leave is sanctioned except in emergencies. Any interruption in a student's attendance during the course of the study through illness or other extraordinary circumstances must be notified to the Director of the Institute in Written with necessary supporting documents/testimonials. Students will be posted under the teaching personnel & they must inform & obtain due permission from the supervisor in case they have some urgent work & want to go for an hour or so. The Head of the Institution reserves the right to grant terms. Every student will have to give an undertaking in relation to compliance of all rules and regulations of the training institution. The decision of the Head of the department/Institute shall be final and binding in all matters pertaining to discipline and professional behavior.
