Preamble:

Russian is one of the important Foreign Languages in India. SPPU is one of the few centres in India, where Russian language and literature are taught at postgraduate level as well as for research degrees like M. Phil. And Ph.D. The courses offered in SPPU for post graduate degree cover a broad base of Language, Literature and Culture Studies courses. Taking cognizance of the latest developments in the field of Language, Literature and Culture Studies of the NEP, it is necessary, therefore, to update and revise existing syllabus of M.A. in Russian. While designing the course an attempt has been made to encourage interest of the Learners towards academic research in interdisciplinary areas. Certain skill based courses are added so as to enhance the employability of the Learners.

Programme Aims:

- To provide comprehensive knowledge of Russian Language and Literature.
- To enable the Learners to undertake research in Comparative studies and Translation
- To enable them to work as experts in area studies
- To inculcate scientific and rational temperament
- To develop intercultural communication competence.

Programme Objectives:

- To build the Russian grammar skills and develop the speech habits and skills, both spoken and written
- To achieve the faculty of independent comprehension and analysis of texts on modern Russian Language
- To understand the literary tradition of Modern Russian Language. To understand the principles of literary criticism and how literature is connected with the society
- To understand the language structure, relationship between the cognitive and communicative functions fulfilled by Language
- To enable them to work as teachers and trainers of Russian Language in various organizations and institutes.
- To provide the students with an overview of origins and development of Russian culture and civilization. As also the political geography of Russia and contemporary issues faced by Russia.
- To develop skills in theory and practice of translation and Interpretation
- To develop the faculties and an aptitude for foreign language research
