CC201_1 NCC (Theory & Practice) – II

(National Integration & Awareness, Social Service & Community Development)

For Semester III Credits: 2, Marks: 50 Total hours: 60 hours

(Note: These Co-Curricular Courses related to National Cadet Course are only for the NCC Cadets. These courses require regular attendance, parade, discipline and participation in various camps. For the students who are not the NCC cadets courses on similar line would be developed in the future.)

Course Objectives:

1. Recognize the significance and necessity of national integration.
2. To develop sense of patriotism and national integrity.
3. To motivate cadets to contribute towards nation building.
4. To inculcate the values and skills involved in providing voluntary Social Service.

Course Outcome:

After completing this course, the cadet shall be able to:

1. Actively promote national integration and understand its significance.
2. Explore ways to spread patriotism and national integrity.
3. Preserve cultural heritage of the nation.
4. Contribute in social welfare and tackle persisting problems in society.

COURSE CONTENT

- **National Integration and Awareness (Theory) (1 Credit)**

1. National Integration: Importance & Necessity
2. Problems and Challenges of National Integration.
3. Unity in Diversity & Role of NCC in Nation Building
4. Contribution of youth in National Integration

- **Social Service and Community Development (SSCD) (Practical) (1 Credit)**

1. Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Nasha Mukt Bharat Abhiyan & Human Trafficking etc.
2. Road Safety and Traffic Control, Blood and Organ donation drives, etc.
3. Cyber security, Digital India Awareness etc.
4. Counter Terrorism, Introduction to RTI & RTE etc.

(Note: The institutions may conduct any such activities to engage cadets in Social service and Community Development activities and thereby evaluate them for practical component)

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Instructions:

1. Applicability of the Course:

This course shall be applicable only to those students who are formally registered as NCC Cadets in the respective college / institute.

2. Maintenance of Records and Documentation:

All academic and activity-related records, including but not limited to cadet/student registration details, attendance records, activity reports, photographs should be maintained and preserved by the Associate NCC Officer (ANO)/ or Caretaker Officer (CTO) or any other concerned teacher of college or Department/Institution for all exam related purposes.

3. Evaluation and Assessment:

The evaluation and assessment of cadets/students shall be based on active participation, attendance, performance standards, discipline and the quality of reports prepared by cadets/students on NCC activities undertaken during the semester. The assessment and certification of performance shall be carried out solely by the Associate NCC Officer (ANO)/ or Caretaker Officer (CTO) or any other concerned teacher of college or Department/Institution for all exam related purposes, in accordance with University norms and evaluation guidelines.

Internal Assessment Criteria (50 Marks) – Assignments/Reports/Short Quizzes:

The internal assessment of NCC shall be based on the **Assignments/Reports/Short Quizzes** individually prepared/attempted by the cadet/student reflecting participation, learning outcomes, and impact of NCC activities undertaken during the semester.

- **The Assignments/Reports/Short Quizzes shall be Original and individually attempted.**

Mode of Evaluation

- **The Associate NCC Officer (ANO)/ or Caretaker Officer (CTO) or any other concerned teacher of college or Department/Institution for all exam related purposes** shall conduct and evaluate from the above-mentioned Internal Assessment Criteria and award marks.
- The assessment shall be **internal** and based on **continuous participation**

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
